A Workshop on Access to Justice and Legal Awareness Camp was organised by the CCLELAC, NLUJAA in collaboration with IQAC, Binadi Chandra Medhi College, Ramdia, at the premises of Binadi Chandra Medhi College, Ramdia on December 6, 2023. The guest speaker for the event was Prof. (Dr) Ramesh Borpatra Gohain, Former Advocate General of Assam. Dr. A. K. Paul, Principal, B.C. Medhi College, Ramdia, faculty members of the College, Dr. Kailash Jeenger, Associate Professor of Law, NLUJAA and member CCLELAC, Dr. Himangshu Ranjan Nath, Assistant Professor of Law, NLUJAA and member CCLELAC, the students of the college, the students of the NLUJAA and members of Women Self-Help Group were present in the program.
