

WELCOME ADDRESS Cum VICE-CHANCELLOR'S REPORT

Kotiswar Singh, Judge, Supreme Court of India; esteemed sitting and former Judges of the Gauhati High Court; distinguished members of the University's Statutory Authorities — the General Council, the Executive Council, the Academic Council, the Finance Committee, and the Academic Planning Board; respected dignitaries who have graced this solemn ceremony with their presence; parents, friends, and well-wishers of the University; my colleagues; and above all, the proud graduands of the day....

A Convocation is not merely a ceremonial gathering; it is the culmination of years of academic pursuit, perseverance, and growth. For our graduands, this day marks the formal completion of their academic journey at NLUJA, Assam, and the beginning of a new chapter where they carry forward the knowledge, values, and discipline acquired here. For the University, it represents a milestone in our ongoing endeavour to nurture talent, foster learning, and contribute meaningfully to justice, knowledge, and society.

To the parents and families gathered here, this day is a fulfilment of the aspirations you nurtured for your children — the long-held hopes and efforts invested in their education find tangible expression today in their academic achievements and the recognition of their hard work. Your steadfast support and sacrifice have been instrumental in bringing them to this moment of pride.

On behalf of the University, I extend my warmest welcome to each one of you, and it is my pleasure to now present the report of the University's activities and achievements since our last Convocation.

A. Developments in University Academia: Curriculum, Pedagogy, and Holistic Learning

At the core of NLUJA, Assam's academic mission lies the commitment to cultivate legal professionals who are not only competent and knowledgeable but also attuned to societal realities, global legal developments, and the imperatives of an evolving profession. The University has continually strengthened its curricula, pedagogy, and faculty engagement to create a vibrant and responsive academic ecosystem that prepares students to navigate the complexities of contemporary legal practice.

Curriculum Development and Multidisciplinary Integration

The University's academic programmes, both at the undergraduate (B.A. LL.B. (Hons)) and postgraduate (LL.M. One Year) levels, are designed to provide a solid foundation in law while simultaneously fostering interdisciplinary insight. The integrated UG curriculum balances rigorous legal training—comprising compulsory core courses, clinical and specialized law papers—with courses drawn from Humanities and Social Sciences. This structure enables students to contextualize legal knowledge within broader socio-economic, political, and cultural frameworks, and facilitates in-depth exploration of areas of specialization. At the postgraduate level, courses integrate national and international perspectives to equip students with a holistic understanding of law in a globalized context.

Significant attention has been paid to embedding multi-dimensional courses that engage with regional, national, and international issues. From modules on environmental law, gender justice, and human rights, to applied learning in intellectual property rights, traditional knowledge systems, and regional industries such as tea and oil, the curriculum exemplifies the University's commitment to relevance, innovation, and the preservation of cultural and natural heritage. The IPR Chair, for instance, integrates practical training on patenting and commercialization of regional products, bridging local knowledge with global markets.

Student-Centric Pedagogy and Experiential Learning

NLUJA, Assam actively promotes participative and experiential learning, moving beyond conventional lecture-based teaching to methods that foster critical thinking, problem-solving, and hands-on engagement. Students engage in moot court exercises, internships, court and prison visits, and trial observation programs that provide immersive exposure to the practice

of law. Mandatory internships of twenty weeks, complemented by an Internship Diary evaluation, ensure that practical learning is systematically assessed. Clinical courses, including legal aid and public interest lawyering, allow students to apply legal knowledge to address real-world community challenges, promoting both professional skill development and social responsibility.

The University emphasizes litigation skills through comprehensive coverage of procedural law, drafting and pleading, trial advocacy, and alternative dispute resolution. Guest lectures and workshops by judges and practitioners further bridge theory and practice, cultivating students' preparedness to navigate diverse professional arenas. Complementing these are courses in emerging areas such as environmental law, intellectual property, international law, and socio-economic offences, which foster both expertise and ethical consciousness.

Holistic Development and Inclusivity

Recognizing the diversity of students' abilities and learning needs, the University has implemented multiple initiatives to support differentiated learning. The Mentor-Mentee programme ensures individualized guidance, while schemes such as Peer Teaching, Learn-to-Teach, and Teaching Assistantships enable collaborative learning and capacity building. The University's Centres for Disability Studies, Career Counselling, and Capacity Building exemplify its commitment to inclusion, accessibility, and professional development for all students.

Cross-cutting themes such as professional ethics, constitutional and human values, gender, environment, and sustainability are systematically integrated across the curriculum, ensuring that students develop not only intellectual competence but also social and ethical awareness. Specialized modules, workshops, and interactions with practitioners and experts in diverse fields provide multi-perspective insights that enrich students' understanding of law in complex, real-world contexts.

Faculty Development and Academic Dynamism

The University equally invests in faculty development, facilitating participation in Faculty Development Programmes, orientation sessions, workshops, conferences, and cross-institutional exposures. Faculty engagement with contemporary scholarship ensures that

syllabi remain responsive to evolving legal, social, and technological landscapes. ICT-enabled teaching tools, smart classrooms, and online resources further support innovative and interactive pedagogy, fostering an environment in which students are encouraged to actively participate and critically engage with the material.

Continuous Evaluation and Learning Outcomes

NLUJA, Assam maintains a rigorous and transparent evaluation framework aligned with clearly articulated Programme Outcomes and Course Objectives. Assessment methods—including theoretical, practical, project-based, problem-solving, and participatory exercises—are calibrated to the nature of each course, ensuring measurable learning outcomes. Regular student feedback, curriculum review by the Academic Planning Board, and iterative syllabus updates underpin a system of continual academic improvement, reflecting the University's commitment to both excellence and relevance.

The University's academic evolution reflects a dynamic balance of rigorous legal training, interdisciplinary exposure, experiential learning, and inclusive pedagogy. It is a model of an evolving institution that not only imparts knowledge but also shapes ethically aware, socially responsive, and professionally competent legal practitioners.

B. Institutional Development, Research, Outreach, and Student Empowerment at NLUJA, Assam

NLUJA, Assam has steadily established itself as a recognized centre of legal education by integrating academic rigor, practical skill-building, and socially responsive initiatives. The University's approach is holistic, encompassing not only curriculum and pedagogy but also governance, research, student development, and community engagement, ensuring that its graduates are professionally competent, ethically grounded, and socially conscious.

Research and Capacity-Building Initiatives

The University has fostered a culture of inquiry and professional readiness through targeted programs that enhance both legal knowledge and practical skills. Judicial preparation and UPSC-orientation sessions, capacity-building workshops, and specialized programs on corporate litigation and career counselling exemplify its focus on equipping students for

diverse professional pathways. In addition, the Centre for Gender Justice has conducted initiatives aimed at empowering female students by enabling engagement with legal professionals, psychologists, and technical experts. Internship programs, clinical legal aid, and moot court exercises bridge the gap between theory and practice, ensuring students acquire hands-on experience alongside academic learning.

Student Leadership and Governance

Active student participation is central to the University's governance model. The Student Bar Council (SBC), comprising elected representatives and multiple specialized committees, works collaboratively with faculty and administration to shape academic policies, welfare initiatives, and co-curricular programming. Through this participatory framework, students contribute to drafting policies such as Hostel and Campus Welfare Rules, Moot Court regulations, and Placement Guidelines. Committees focused on sports, culture, literary pursuits, and internships foster leadership, teamwork, and organizational skills, while enabling a student-centric approach to institutional decision-making.

Inclusive Campus and Social Responsibility

NLUJA prioritizes diversity, equity, and inclusion. Committees such as the Equal Opportunities Cell and SC/ST Cell provide academic, financial, and mentoring support to marginalized students, ensuring a campus environment rooted in tolerance and equity. Co-curricular activities, community engagement, and pro bono legal initiatives reinforce constitutional values, civic responsibility, and social justice. Sensitization workshops, dialogues, and events addressing gender, environmental sustainability, and human rights cultivate awareness, empathy, and ethical decision-making among students and staff alike.

Holistic Development and Co-Curricular Engagement

Beyond academics, the University actively promotes the all-round development of its students. Cultural festivals, sports events, and commemorations of national and international days' foster creativity, teamwork, and a sense of civic pride. Initiatives such as yoga workshops, leadership training, peer mentoring, and capacity-building programs further strengthen personal growth, resilience, and professional preparedness. The emphasis on experiential learning—through internships, court visits, and practical workshops—ensures that students are ready to navigate the demands of the legal profession while remaining socially responsible.

Participative and Decentralized Governance

The University follows a consultative, decentralized model of governance. Committees comprising faculty, administrative officials, and students deliberate on academic, administrative, and policy matters, promoting transparency, efficiency, and ownership among stakeholders. This collaborative approach enables NLUJA to respond effectively to challenges, continuously improve institutional processes, and sustain high standards in teaching, research, and student welfare.

Research and Community Outreach

Faculty and student research activities, seminars, and public lectures address contemporary legal issues and societal concerns. The University encourages engagement with local communities, government agencies, and civil society organizations, translating academic learning into social impact. This integration of scholarship, advocacy, and outreach strengthens both the relevance of education and the University's role as a socially responsive institution.

NLUJA, Assam exemplifies a model of legal education where academic excellence, professional skill development, participative governance, inclusivity, and societal engagement converge. Its initiatives reflect a commitment not merely to impart knowledge, but to shape ethically aware, socially responsible, and professionally adept legal practitioners prepared to contribute meaningfully to the evolving demands of law and society.

C. University Infrastructure and Sustainable Environment at NLUJA, Assam

National Law University and Judicial Academy, Assam, is a fully residential campus situated at Amingaon, Guwahati, designed to provide a modern, conducive, and inclusive learning environment. The University's infrastructure seamlessly integrates academic, administrative, and recreational facilities, reflecting its commitment to holistic education and student wellbeing.

Academic and Administrative Facilities

The Academic Block is equipped with state-of-the-art, ICT-enabled classrooms designed to support interactive and technology-driven learning. These include fully air-conditioned gallery smart classrooms with capacities ranging from 25 to 60 students, conventional classrooms with Wi-Fi access, whiteboards, and smart boards, ensuring that both large lectures and small group discussions are well-supported. Complementing this is a Moot Court Hall with a seating capacity of 60, facilitating practical learning in legal advocacy, complete with soundproofing, high-definition projectors, video conferencing systems, and smart boards. The Administrative Block hosts two modern conference rooms with capacities of 30 and 40, furnished with similar facilities to support seminars, workshops, and administrative meetings.

Embracing the digital age, the University has integrated Google Classroom into its academic framework, enabling seamless distribution of study materials, submission of assignments, and faculty-student interaction, thereby fostering a connected and collaborative learning environment

Sports, Wellness, and Recreation

NLUJA, Assam, promotes physical fitness and holistic development through a range of indoor and outdoor sports facilities. The Indoor Hall cum Sports Complex, spanning 17,500 square feet, houses two synthetic badminton courts, four table tennis boards, and carom boards, while sprawling cricket, football, and volleyball grounds cater to outdoor sports enthusiasts. The campus also offers two fully equipped gyms, located in the boys' and girls' hostels, and a meditation room within the library, providing students and faculty with spaces for wellness, mindfulness, and reflection. The Indoor Hall doubles as the University Auditorium, featuring a 30x24 feet stage for cultural performances and formal events.

Sustainability and Green Initiatives

NLUJA, Assam, exemplifies environmental stewardship through its comprehensive adoption of sustainable energy and green practices. A 285-kilowatt solar power plant, implemented under the RESCO model in collaboration with M/S Suryam International Pvt. Ltd., supplies clean energy to the campus and contributes excess power to the local grid. LED lighting across all buildings enhances energy efficiency and reduces the carbon footprint, while rainwater harvesting systems and a vermicomposting plant demonstrate the University's commitment to water conservation and sustainable waste management.

The campus actively promotes eco-conscious practices among students, including bans on single-use plastics and restrictions on internal motor vehicle traffic, with electric vehicles permitted as a sustainable alternative. Extensive landscaping and tree plantations create shaded, aesthetically pleasing outdoor spaces that improve air quality and contribute to a serene campus environment.

Accessibility and Inclusivity

NLUJA, Assam, ensures that its infrastructure is accessible to all. Wheelchair ramps, Brailleprinted lift buttons, and dedicated washrooms for differently-abled students, along with a specialized reading room equipped with screen-reading software, reflect the University's commitment to inclusivity and equal opportunity. These facilities empower students with diverse needs to engage fully in academic and campus life.

Through the integration of modern facilities, sustainable practices, and inclusive design, National Law University and Judicial Academy, Assam, not only supports academic excellence but also cultivates a campus culture rooted in well-being, environmental responsibility, and social equity. This infrastructure ensures that students are equipped to thrive in a demanding professional world while remaining mindful of their responsibilities towards society and the environment.

D. Student Achievements and Activities at NLUJA, Assam (2024–25)

The students of National Law University and Judicial Academy, Assam, have demonstrated exemplary talent, commitment, and versatility over the past year, excelling in academics, moot court competitions, sports, and cultural pursuits. Their achievements reflect not only

individual excellence but also the University's emphasis on holistic development, leadership, and active participation in national and international platforms.

Moot Court and Legal Competitions

NLUJA students have continued to uphold the University's strong tradition in legal advocacy and mooting. In the **Dr. RohiniKantaBarouh Memorial National Moot Court Competition**, the team comprising Maahi Agarwal, Rishika Sharma, and Debarathi Chattopadhyay secured the **Best Team and Best Memorial Award**, while Rishika Sharma was adjudged **Best Mooter**. At the **12th RCL Moot Court Competition**, DhruvVashisht was conferred the **Best Speaker title**, and the team of Rishav Srivastava and PriyanshKanawat reached the semi-finals. Students further distinguished themselves in national and international competitions, including the **INTA Asia-Pacific Moot Court Competition** and the **Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition**, earning accolades for oralist skills, negotiation plans, and team performance. These achievements underscore the University's emphasis on practical skill-building, critical thinking, and professional readiness.

Sports and Physical Excellence

NLUJA students have showcased exceptional prowess in sports at various inter-university competitions. Highlights include multiple gold and silver medals in table tennis, badminton, and football, as well as commendable performances in athletics, including 400m, 800m, and 1500m races, shot put, and relay events. Notable performers include Pranabjyoti Biswas, who won gold medals in the 20th Asian Jump Rope Championship, and BedashmritaPrashar, who secured gold in women's doubles table tennis at Colossus 2024, Hidayatullah National Law University. These accomplishments reflect the University's commitment to fostering physical fitness, teamwork, and competitive spirit among students.

Cultural, Quiz, and Youth Leadership

Beyond academics and sports, students actively engaged in quizzes, debates, and leadership

forums. Teams achieved top positions in inter-institutional quizzes such as the All Assam Inter-Institutional Quiz and the Runners-Up Foundation Day Quiz 2.0 – Gauhati University. ShalinBukalsaria was selected as the Youth Delegate for the Union Minister of Ports, Shipping & Waterways at Sagarmanthan: The Great Oceans Dialogue. Such recognitions highlight students' intellectual curiosity, civic engagement, and leadership potential.

Overall Impact

The past year has been marked by numerous individual and team successes that exemplify NLUJA's philosophy of **holistic student development**. Students' achievements across mooting, sports, quizzes, and leadership initiatives not only bring laurels to the University but also cultivate a culture of excellence, resilience, and teamwork. These accomplishments reaffirm NLUJA's position as a premier institution nurturing well-rounded legal professionals who are prepared to contribute meaningfully to society and the profession.

E. University Publications: Advancing Knowledge, Research, and Regional Engagement

National Law University and Judicial Academy, Assam, has consistently emphasized the role of scholarly publications as a key instrument for research, academic ideation, and knowledge dissemination. The University's flagship journals exemplify this commitment. The NLUA Law Review, a student-led journal, provides a platform for emerging legal scholars to explore contemporary issues, hone their analytical skills, and contribute to legal discourse. Complementing this, the NLUA Law and Policy Review, a faculty-led journal, showcases rigorous scholarship, policy-oriented research, and interdisciplinary perspectives, reflecting the University's engagement with complex legal and societal challenges.

Beyond journals, NLUJA has made significant contributions to knowledge creation through books and specialized publications. Works such as the Handbook on Geographical Indications, with a focus on the North-East region, illustrate the University's effort to integrate local knowledge and regional legal concerns into scholarly discourse. Publications like Tribal Law, Policy and Justice and Krishna and Mediation highlight the University's engagement with Indian Knowledge Systems, mediation practices, and culturally grounded legal frameworks. The University's IPR-focused journal (NLUA Journal of Intellectual

Property Rights), and **Lex Terra**, dedicated to environmental law and sustainability, underscore its commitment to addressing contemporary legal challenges.

Student creativity and initiative find expression in publications such as **Lost Stories**, which nurture literary and narrative skills alongside legal education. Collectively, these publications also reflect the University's active engagement with evolving educational frameworks, including contributions to discussions on the **New Education Policy**, and cover a wide spectrum of relevant legal and policy areas.

Through its diverse and focused publications, NLUJA, Assam, not only promotes rigorous research and academic exploration but also reinforces its ethos of **regional relevance**, **interdisciplinary inquiry**, **and socially responsive scholarship**, positioning the University as a vibrant hub of legal knowledge and intellectual enterprise.

F. Institutional Collaborations

The University recognizes that a vibrant academic environment must be rooted in collaboration and exchange with institutions that bring diverse expertise and perspectives. In pursuit of this vision, NLUJA, Assam has consciously cultivated partnerships that cut across national and international universities, state institutions, professional bodies, and global networks. These collaborations are not symbolic; they constitute meaningful engagements that enhance teaching, research, and the practice of law.

Memoranda of Understanding with leading National Law Universities create avenues for joint research, faculty and student exchange, and the co-hosting of academic events. These arrangements enrich the curriculum and expose our students and scholars to varied pedagogical and research traditions within the country's premier legal institutions.

At the state and national level, the University's collaborative ventures with the State Police Accountability Commission, the National Commission for Women, and the Revenue and Disaster Management Department, Government of Assam, have given rise to research and training initiatives that combine academic rigor with urgent social relevance. These engagements provide students and faculty opportunities to work on pressing issues such as gender justice, accountability in law enforcement, and disaster law and policy—thereby situating the University's scholarship within lived realities.

The University has also forged strong links with international and national networks. Engagement with the Critical Criminology Network of the British Society of Criminology provides an intellectual space for dialogue on global issues of crime, justice, and power, while collaborations with UNICEF and WWF bring the University into conversation with global agendas of child rights and environmental sustainability. Similarly, projects supported by the Ministry of Social Justice and Welfare, the Ministry of Information and Communication, and the Ministry of Industry and Commerce have enabled our scholars to contribute to policy development at the national level. The conferment of an Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Chair by the Ministry of Industry and Commerce stands as recognition of the University's growing strength in this field, providing a platform for research, capacity building, and advocacy in the area of intellectual property.

Through these collaborations, NLUJA, Assam fosters a knowledge ecosystem where academic inquiry is strengthened by practice-based insights, and research outcomes are informed by the priorities of governance, justice delivery, and global sustainability. This ecosystem nurtures our students and faculty alike, enabling them to grow as scholars, professionals, and socially responsive citizens.

G. Distinguished Academicians and Eminent Speakers

NLUJA, Assam has consistently sought to animate its academic environment by inviting eminent academicians, jurists, and practitioners whose intellectual contributions enrich classroom learning and research culture. The University's roster of **Distinguished Faculty** includes towering figures such as **Prof. (Dr.) UpendraBaxi**, **Hon'ble Mr. Justice Uday U. Lalit**, **Hon'ble Justice A.K. Sikri**, **Hon'ble Justice Dinesh Maheshwari**, **Prof. (Dr.) B.B. Pande**, and **Prof. (Dr.) M.P. Singh**. Their scholarship in constitutional law, human rights, criminal justice, and comparative law provides students and faculty with unparalleled access to deep theoretical and doctrinal insights.

In addition to its eminent faculty, the University has hosted an impressive array of distinguished speakers through lectures, symposia, and academic events. Scholars such as Prof. Benjamin Gregg (University of Texas at Austin) and Prof.UmeshBanakar (USA) have brought global perspectives on indigeneity, intellectual property, and law's interface with technology. Jurists such as Hon'ble Justice P. Naveen Rao (Telangana High Court), Hon'ble Mr. Justice BirendraSaraf, and Hon'ble Justice DamaSeshadri Naidu have

delivered lectures on constitutional morality, judicial reasoning, and dispute resolution, translating judicial wisdom into lessons for budding lawyers.

Prominent legal academics including **Prof.Vijender Kumar** (Vice-Chancellor, MNLU Nagpur) and **Prof. B.T. Kaul** have also engaged with the University, offering comparative reflections on family law, criminal law, and public law. The presence of sectoral specialists such as **Ms. Kajri Roy** (Legal Advisor, BCCI) has added contemporary dimensions—like sports law—to the University's academic discourse.

Together, these engagements not only expose students to diverse perspectives but also reinforce NLUJA, Assam's role as a hub for critical reflection and knowledge production. By drawing on the expertise of such eminent figures, the University fosters an intellectual culture that bridges theory and practice, national and international scholarship, and law's deep connection with society.

H. University Events for Students

At NLUJA, Assam, the student experience extends well beyond the classroom. The University nurtures a vibrant culture of academic, literary, cultural, and sporting events that foster holistic growth, sharpen professional skills, and cultivate camaraderie within the student community.

Among the flagship student-driven initiatives is the Gurjeet Singh Memorial National Moot Court Competition, a prestigious annual event that attracts participation from leading law schools across the country. It provides a platform for students to hone advocacy, research, and drafting skills in a competitive setting that mirrors real-world legal practice. Complementing this is the VoxAnatolis Regional Moot Court Competition, which encourages regional engagement and strengthens the advocacy tradition among younger batches of students.

NLUJA AT A GLANCE

Foundational Information and Academic Focus National Law University and Judicial Academy (NLUJA), Assam, holds significance as the first National Law University established in the North-Eastern region of India, with a mission to disseminate advanced legal education. It was established by the enactment of the National Law School and Judicial Academy, Assam Act, 2009, and later amended in 2011 to confer university status. The institution operates under the Chancellorship of the Chief Justice of the Gauhati High Court.

The university offers comprehensive academic programs, including the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Five Year Integrated Course, LL.M.One Year Course, and a Ph.D. Programme. It is recognized bythe Bar Council of India and the University Grants Commission(UGC) under Section 12-B. The University received its first accreditation from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council(NAAC) in 2025 and secured a position among the top 40 institutions of legal education in India as per the National InstitutionalRanking Framework (NIRF) 2025.

The core mission is to promote legal education that aligns with global standards while remaining sensitive to the local context. The curriculum integrates multidisciplinary courses in every semester and includes core papers, clinical papers, optional papers, and specialized group papers. These courses cover areas such as Indian Jurisprudence, the Tea Industry, and Oil and Natural Gas to address local, regional, and national relevance.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

NLUJA is a residential campus located on a sprawling 50-acre area at Agyathuri, Amingaon, along the Brahmaputra River.

Teaching and Administrative Facilities: The campus features modern infrastructure, including the Administrative Block, Academic Block, and hostel facilities. The Academic Block is air-conditioned and houses smart classrooms with features like smart boards and projectors. The Administrative Block includes essential offices, conference halls, and a Moot Court Hall designed to replicate a High Court bench. The campus has a total of 17 fully air-conditioned and equipped lecture galleries, one moot court hall, and two conference rooms.

• Library (Knowledge Resource Centre): The state-of-the-art library is a four-storied, air-conditioned, Wi-Fi, and CCTV-enabled building covering approximately 50,000 sq. ft.. It is equipped with individual study cubicles, separate reading rooms, a meditation room, 160 computers, over 20,000 printed collections, 50 periodicals, and 13 digital databases. The library is automated using Koha, the world's first open-access Integrated Library Management System (ILMS), and is a member of DELNET and INFLIBNET. It provides remote access services and has a designated room with specialized computers and screen-reading software (NVDA) for persons with disabilities.

• ICT Facilities: The entire campus, including hostels, has seamless Wi-Fi connectivity. The IT Section provides network and wireless services, web hosting, and email service. The University is provided with a free Internet bandwidth of 1 Gbps by the National Knowledge Network. The university utilizes Google Classroom as a central platform for academic activities like distribution of study materials and submission of assignments.

Green Campus Initiatives The institution is committed to sustainable environmental practices, implementing several initiatives on campus:

 Renewable Energy: The University has adopted a 285-kilowatt solar energy system operating on the RESCO (Renewable Energy Service Company) model. Excess solar power generated is supplied to the APDCL grid, adding revenue to the University's account.

- Waste Management: A vermicomposting plant is established on the premises to reduce organic waste sent to landfills and create nutrient-rich fertilizer. An effective biomedical waste management system is in place at the medical centre using distinct color-coded bins. The IT Section also meticulously repairs minor defects in electronic gadgets to extend their lifespan and employs responsible disposal of e-waste.
- Conservation and Sustainability: The campus has a rainwater harvesting system near the Academic Block for bore well recharge. The use of plastic and motor vehicles is restricted on campus, with the exception of electric vehicles, to reduce pollution and promote a pedestrian-friendly environment.

- Mentoring: The Mentor-Mentee Programme places all students (UG and PG) under individual mentors in a 1:17 ratio to address their academic and personal requirements. Other programs include the 'Learn to Teach' Programme and 'Peer Teaching Programme' to support academic development and skill honing.
- Counselling and Medical: A Health Centre provides 24/7 medical assistance with a doctor and a full-time nurse, and 24/7 ambulance service. Psychological counselling is also available by a trained counsellor.

Infrastructural Expansion

• **300 Bedded Student Hostel:** The construction of a 300 bedded student hostel has commenced and is nearing completion. The 300 bedded hostel is a six floor (G+5) building with 18000 square feet plinth area.

The hostel building will consist of 150 single occupancy rooms and 90 double occupancy rooms along with a separate warden's room, warden office room, visitor's lounge, visitor's room, sick room, coffee shop, student mess, common room, study room etc. Washrooms will be constructed for the students at a ratio of 1:6. There will be four staircases and four lifts for the students along with the ramp at the entrance.

 Vice-Chancellors' Residence: The Vice-Chancellor's residence is under construction and approaching completion. The Vice-Chancellors' Residence is a duplex bungalow (G+1) with total area of 6250 square feet. The building will consist of four bedrooms, and a drawing cum dining room. There will be separate rooms for VC Office, caretaker, servant room, guest-room, waiting room etc. in the bungalow. The premise would also house a landscape garden.
