This meeting was attended by the all members of the IQAC. This meeting was called for discussing following agenda:

SL.	Agenda	Status
1	Activities Report of the Academic year 2025-2026.	The Director, IQAC presented the activities during the Academic Year 2025–2026, including induction cum Orientation Programmes, special lectures, capacity-building Programmes, field visits, legal aid activities, workshops, Moot Court activities, and student development initiatives.
2	Submission of mentor-mentee report.	The faculty members were requested to submit their Mentor–Mentee Reports within the stipulated timeline, as the reports are required for institutional records and for the preparation of NAAC-related documentation, including the AQAR.
3	Proposals for certificate course.	The members discussed the introduction of certificate courses by various Centers and faculty members. Suggestions were received to introduce courses on Cyber Law, Data Privacy, Artificial Intelligence Governance, Block chain, and other emerging areas. It was resolved that Centres and interested faculty members shall submit proposals for certificate courses for implementation in the forthcoming semesters.
4	Preparation of AQAR Report.	The members discussed the preparation of the AQAR. It was resolved that committees shall be constituted for collecting data under the various NAAC criteria and necessary information shall be compiled for timely preparation and submission of the AQAR.

5.	Suggestions for improvements and programmes that the IQAC should conduct.	Several valuable suggestions were received from the external members. These included strengthening practical and industry-oriented legal training, organizing expert lectures by practitioners, increasing field-based learning activities, conducting mental health awareness programmes, strengthening legal aid and community outreach initiatives, introducing workshops on disability inclusion and accessibility, improving stakeholder feedback mechanisms, revising and enhancing student sports and wellness facilities. The IQAC resolved to consider and implement these suggestions in a phased manner.
6.	Proposed activities	The members discussed proposed activities for the Academic Year 2026–2027, including training Programmes for officers and Administrative staff, research and publication training, FDPs, short-term courses, lecture series on contemporary legal issues, increased collaboration with institutions through MoUs, SWAYAM course development, internships for MCA students through collaboration with higher education institutions, and international collaborations with foreign universities. The proposals were noted and approved in principle for further action.
