CELAR endeavours to be a torchbearer of NLUJAA's mission to translate legal knowledge and skills into an instrument that addresses various environmental concerns of the country and especially the North-Eastern region of India.

The main objectives of CELAR can be elucidated as follows:

- Providing students with hands-on advocacy experience and direct exposure to the issues to inspire and educate them.
- Strengthen access to justice by undertaking high-quality multi-disciplinary research.
- Hold conferences, workshops and seminars on current environmental legal issues to further disseminate and encourage an exchange of ideas.
- Advocate for reforms in environmental law through scientifically sound legislative proposals.
- Organize training programmes for civil servants, law enforcement agencies, non-governmental organisations, and media professionals to improve their legal capacity on environmental laws and policy.

Centre convenor and other members

Centre Activities

Students enrolment and their responsibilities

following procedure will be followed to nominate/appoint student's volunteers in the centre

- To open the registration for student's participation at the beginning of academic year through notice to students
- The centre will accommodate the students as per willingness of the students
- Once students are enrolled as member the centre convenor initiate the meeting and guide and discuss with the students about action plan for academic year
- Any bona-fide student of BA.LLB. can apply for membership in centre

- The centre's activities will be run through student's participation from different classes.
- The interested students may nominate their names to the centre convenor at the beginning of semester.
- Initially the students were admitted for one year as members of centre and assign various role and responsibility as set by the centre.
- Two senior students (seniority shall be counted as per their previous participation in centre and active participation in various activities) will assign the job of centre student coordinators
- Among the registered student's, student coordinator for Lex Tera, social
 media, seminar and conferences, Research book/project etc. along with
 assistant coordinator and members will be nominated by centre convenor
 (the criteria of selection is based on student's active participation in various
 activities/programme in last preceding year will be consider).
- The centre student coordinators will manage the centre activities with the approval of competent authority through centre convenor.
- The centre member will meet as and when required or directed by the centre convenor or students convenors to discuss action plan and other activities.
- The student's participant is free to withdraw their membership at any time after their selection by addressing in writing to centre convenor.
- No students will be allowing to claim any rights/privileges/authority etc. merely on the ground of his/her membership
- No academic benefits (special marks in project/seminar/exam, grade, etc.)
 will be given to students in their regular BALLB course
- All members are bound to follow the discipline/rules/policies framed by the centre time to time
